*This study aims to describe the use of code mixing and code switching in the social interactions of transmigrant communities in Atulintang District, Central Aceh Regency. This study uses a qualitative descriptive method with a data collection technique using free listening and conversation techniques. The focus of the study lies in the form of code mixing, which includes the insertion of words, phrases, and clauses from various regional languages such as Javanese, Acehnese, and Madurese into Indonesian sentences. Based on the results of conversation data analysis, it was found that code mixing is actively used in everyday social interactions, especially in informal situations. The most frequently used form of code mixing is words, followed by phrases and clauses. Meanwhile, code switching is also a common phenomenon, especially internal code switching from regional languages to Indonesian, which occurs naturally as a form of adjustment to the background of the interlocutor. Code mixing and code switching reflect the social dynamics, linguistic flexibility, and cultural integration that are typical in the transmigrant environment.*
