Resolving Violations of the Professional Code of Ethics for Police Members Who Commit Crimes (Lhoksumawe Police Research Study)

Resolving violations of the police professional code of ethics, which result in criminal acts, will be processed first in a disciplinary hearing. This is because there is a time limit for holding disciplinary hearings, namely a maximum of 30 (thirty) days as stated in Article 19, Lhokseumawe KKEP Police Decree Number: Put KKEP / 06 / IV / 2018 / KKep, dated 27 April 2018 PTDH.

The purpose of this research is to determine the resolution of violations of the professional code of ethics for police officers who commit criminal acts, and to determine the form of sanctions against members of the National Police who commit criminal acts of violating the code of ethics at the Lhokseumawe Police.

The type of research is, research empirical law with statutory, conceptual and sociological approaches. Data collection techniques in this research are interviews and documentation, as well as data analysis, namely descriptive qualitative. The results of this research show that violations of the professional code of ethics for members of the police, who commit criminal acts, include the recipient of the report, the examination process, the examination in court, the imposition of punishment, the hearing of the National Police Code of Ethics Commission.

Law Number 2 of 2002 and Regulation of the Head of the National Police of the Republic of Indonesia Number 14 of 2011 regulate sanctions for members of the National Police who violate the law or code of ethics. At Lhokseumawe Police, resolving code of ethics violations involves regulatory complexity, internal police factors, and a balance between law enforcement and human rights. Obstacles include unclear internal procedures, institutional norms that protect members, psychological pressure, and limited evidence. Solution efforts include improving regulations, simplifying internal procedures, training, and law enforcement that prioritizes human rights principles. Law enforcement measures include separation of functions, external supervision, disciplinary sanctions, consultation with legal experts, and protection for whistleblowers and witnesses.

The forms of sanctions against members of the National Police who commit criminal acts of violating the code of ethics at the Lhokseumawe Police include violations of personality ethics, state ethics, institutional ethics, ethics in
